By organizing the Battle of Pensacola, the Florida Society Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) Pensacola Chapter is bringing history alive in 2009 during the 450th Anniversary Celebration of the attempted colonization of Pensacola. The battle, which occurred in 1781 over nine weeks, was pivotal.

Field Marshall Bernardo de Galvez commanded several Spanish regiments and was assisted by a French brigade in the siege. He was opposed by Major General James Campbell, who led a much smaller force of British, Germans, Loyalists, freed slaves, and Indians. The events changed the course of history. The SAR hopes to educate and to foster interest in the community's rich heritage.
