Revolutionary Patriots Buried in Florida!

As we all know, Florida wasn't a colony at the time of the American Revolution, and there were only four battles fought in this state including the battles of Alligator Creek, Thomas Creek, Pensacola and the Last Naval Battle off Merritt Island!

However, we know of at least six Patriots who fought in the Revolutionary War who are buried in Northeast Florida's Nassau, Duval, and St. Johns counties according to FindaGrave.com.

Patriots Burris Higginbotham, Amos Latham, John Daniel Vaughn and James Decatur Pelot are buried in Nassau County cemeteries. Captain John Carroll Houston is buried in Jacksonville, and Juan McQueen is buried in St. Augustine.

Burris Higginbotham was born in Virginia in 1759 and died in Georgia in 1816. According to FindaGrave.com, a special marker in the Higginbotham Family Cemetery was dedicated in 2005. He is considered a founding father of Nassau County.

Amos Latham is buried in the Bosque Bello Cemetery in Fernandina Beach. Born July 18, 1759 in Groton, Connecticut, Latham was a corporal in the Revolutionary War and the first keeper of Amelia's Lighthouse in 1838. After his death in Fernandina Beach on April 28, 1842, he was buried near the lighthouse with his wife. The Coast Guard sold part of the property and the graves were moved to the current location, according to FindaGrave.com.

John Vaughn's marker says that he was a Revolutionary War Patriot, and a veteran of the War of 1812, and the Florida Indian Wars. The family cemetery is on land granted by the United States government to the family as a pension in 1832.

James Pelot, who was born January 18, 1743 on a plantation near the Euhaw River in South Carolina served as a petit juror and furnished beef to the Army. He died in 1824 on Amelia Island. Family members believe he and his wife were buried in the Vaughan family cemetery based on the fact that a Pelot descendant married into the Vaughn family.

Captain John Houston, who was born in 1756 and died in Duval County in 1838, is buried in the Houston Cemetery on Talbot Island. At least three Confederate Civil War veterans from his family are buried nearby.

Juan McQueen, whose marker that was placed in 2012, refers to him as both John McQueen and Don Juan McQueen. He was born in 1751 and died in St. Johns County on Oct. 11, 1807.

Juan McQueen was a sea captain and ship owner. As a Revolutionary War patriot, he had business connections with France and carried letters from George Washington to Jean Lafayette to enlist the aid of the French in the American Revolution, according to an entry on FindaGrave.com.

He is thought to be buried in the Old Spanish Cemetery, located near the corner of Orange and Cordova streets within the Historical Old City of St Augustine.

While the cemetery contains about 175 marked graves, the exact location of Juan McQueen's grave site is no longer marked, hence the *National Society Daughters* of the *American Revolution* placed a marker near the grave of Miguel O'Reilly's because he was a known friend of Juan McQueen.

Palm Beach SAR Compatriots are encouraged to continue to research and identify Revolutionary War Veterans and supporters who may be buried in Florida.

As we identify these *Heroes of the Revolution* we can take steps to properly mark their graves in Honor of their service to the founding of our Nation.



Many inventions, developed by PCS, are on permanent display at the Smithsonian Institution. Locally Alex also owned television station WPEC TV-12, the CBS affiliate in West Palm Beach. 




