

# Election of 1800....Contentious as 2020!

The more things change, the more they seem to stay the same... especially when we compare and contrast past presidential elections with the seemingly unprecedented drama in 2020 election.

On February 17, 1801, <u>Thomas Jefferson</u> is elected the third president of the United States.

While the election constituted the first peaceful transfer of power from one political party to another in the United States, it was filled with deep divisions between parties, crude and unseemly conduct by presidential candidates, in fighting between political parties, acrimony, divisions in the populace, and even duels to the death between candidates.

By 1800, when Jefferson decided to run for president, he possessed impressive political credentials and was well-suited to the presidency.

In addition to drafting the <u>Declaration of Independence</u>, Jefferson had served in two <u>Continental Congresses</u>, as minister to France, as Secretary of State under <u>George Washington</u> and as Vice President under <u>John Adams</u>.

However, vicious partisan warfare characterized the campaign of 1800 between *Democratic-Republicans Jefferson* and *Aaron Burr* and *Federalists John Adams, Charles C. Pinckney* and *John Jay*.

The election highlighted the ongoing battle between the *Democratic-Republican* supporters of the *French*, who were embroiled in their own bloody revolution, and the *Pro-British Federalists* who wanted to implement *English*-style policies in American government.

The Federalists abhorred the French revolutionaries' overzealous use of the guillotine and as a result were less forgiving in their foreign policy toward the French. Federalists advocated a strong centralized government, a standing military and financial support of emerging industries.

In contrast, Jefferson's *Republicans* preferred limited government, unadulterated states' rights and a primarily agrarian economy. They feared that *Federalists* would abandon revolutionary ideals on which the United States was founded and revert to the *English Monarchical* style political process.

As Washington's Secretary of State, Jefferson opposed Secretary of the Treasury Alexander Hamilton's proposal to increase military expenditures and plan to launch a National Bank. He resigned when Washington supported the leading Federalist's plan for a national bank.

After a bloodless but ugly political campaign in which candidates and influential supporters on both sides used the press, often anonymously, as a forum to fire slanderous volleys at each other, the then-laborious and confusing process of voting began in April 1800.

Individual states scheduled elections at different times and although Jefferson and Burr ran on the same ticket, as president and vice president respectively, the <u>Constitution</u> still demanded votes for each individual to be counted separately.

As a result, by the end of January 1801, Jefferson and Burr emerged tied at 73 electoral votes apiece. Adams came in third at 65 votes.

This unintended result sent the final vote to the <u>House of Representatives</u>. Sticklers in the Federalist-controlled House of Representatives insisted on following the Constitution's flawed rules and refused to elect Jefferson and Burr together on the same ticket.

The highly influential *Federalist <u>Alexander Hamilton</u>*, who mistrusted Jefferson but truly hated Burr more, persuaded the House to vote against Burr, whom he called *"The most unfit man for the office of president"*. This accusation and many others led Burr to challenge Hamilton to a duel in 1804 that resulted in Hamilton's death.

Two weeks before the scheduled inauguration, Jefferson emerged victorious however, and Burr was confirmed as his vice president. A contingent of sword-bearing soldiers escorted the new president to his inauguration on March 4, 1801, illustrating the contentious nature of the election and the victors' fear of reprisals.

In his inaugural address, Jefferson sought to heal political differences by graciously declaring, "We are all Republicans, we are all Federalists". As president, Jefferson made some concessions to his opponents, including taking Hamilton's advice to strengthen the American Navy.

In 1801, Jefferson sent naval squadrons and Marines to suppress Barbary piracy against American shipping. He reduced the national debt by one-third, acquired the *Louisiana Territory*, and his sponsorship of the <u>Lewis and Clark</u> expedition opened the west to exploration and settlement.

Jefferson's first term ended in relative stability and prosperity, and in 1804 he was overwhelmingly elected to a second term. The flawed voting system that was so problematic in the election of 1800, it was later improved by the *12th Amendment*, which was ratified in 1804.

Palm Beach Chapter SAR Compatriot/Veteran/Author Sonny Barber and his wife Barbara just released their latest book titled "Between the Letters-Life, Love, And War". This moving testimonial to the ravages on the Vietnam War and the inspirational power of love is captured in this latest book from the Barbers, and a must read. Compatriot Barber is also the author of three remarkable American Historical Mystery series for young adults/children titled "Crossed & Found", "Stonewalled", and "Gold Hush".

#### ~ Overview "Between the Letters-Life, Love, And War"~

Separated by war and thousands of miles, a young navy ensign and his nurse fiancée share their everyday experiences from Vietnam and from back home through hundreds of letters, keeping alive their love, hopes and dreams.

Between these letters, the fledgling officer-in-charge of a U.S. Navy Swift Boat shares his first-person stories of life and death in a combat zone.

### ~Plot Description~

"I miss you!" "Why haven't you written?" "Thank God, you're safe!" These are the beginning lines of some of the hundreds of letters between a freshly-commissioned U.S. Navy ensign and his fiancée, a new nurse graduate, from the start of their relationship until eighteen months later when he returns from Vietnam.

Between these letters are first person accounts of the fledgling naval officer's life in charge of a five-man crew aboard a fifty-foot Swift Boat, patrolling the coastal waters and rivers in "I Corps," the northernmost military operational area of South Vietnam.

The letters and stories show the challenges of life—and death—in a combat zone and provide a glimpse into the stress-filled lives of these two young people, separated by the war and thousands of miles across an ocean and a continent.

#### ~About the Authors~

Sonny and Barbara Barber created this heartfelt memoir as a tribute to their life experience, the impact of separation, and a moving testimonial to the ravages on the Vietnam War and the inspirational power of love.

Soon after graduating college, *Rufus R. "Sonny" Barber, Jr.* joined the *U.S. Navy* and volunteered for duty in *Vietnam* as an officer-in-charge of a *"Swift Boat,"* a fifty-foot navy patrol craft.

After his four years of active military service, he worked in public relations and corporate communications, concurrently serving as a public affairs officer in military reserve components and retiring as a Captain from the U.S. Navy Reserve.

In his second career as an author, he's also written several fiction books for preteens and up, which use events in early American history as the basis for modern-day mysteries.
