"Washington @ Princeton" The Portraits Hidden Messages!

American artist *James Wilson Peale* was commissioned by the state of *Pennsylvania* in 1779 to create this historic full-length portrait of *General Washington* following the battle at Princeton, New Jersey. The bright colors and clean outlines in this iconic painting are characteristic of James's style containing profound symbolism and hidden messages.

The original painting of our Founding Father, "Washington at Princeton" was commissioned by the Supreme Executive Council of Pennsylvania for its council chambers in Independence Hall in Philadelphia as an expression of respect, confidence and admiration for General Washington.

Peale made eight copies of the painting. The original, now owned by the *Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts*, was completed in early 1779 when *General Washington* sat for Peale in *Philadelphia*.

Six of the paintings are in several *United States* institutions including the *United States Senate*; the *Metropolitan Museum of Art; Yale University Art Gallery; National Portrait Gallery; Colonial Williamsburg; Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts;* and *Princeton University Art Museum*.

In January 2005, one painting sold for \$21.3 million, and set a record for the highest price paid for an American portrait.

After the *Continental* forces, assisted by the *French*, triumphed over the *British* at *Yorktown* in 1781, *James Peale* sketched the battle site, including a view of the harbor showing the protruding masts of sunken ships.






In addition to the *French* and *American* flags flying above *Washington* and the banners of the conquered at his feet, there are many other hidden symbols in the portrait including:

- 1. The blue banner with 13 white stars in the circle was General Washington's personal flag as Commander-in-Chief of the combined army of the thirteen colonies of the Continental Army.
- 2. Washington, shown relaxed and in control, wears the blue coat with buff trim of the Continental Army. The stars on his shoulders along with the blue sash identify him as the Commander-in Chief. His riding boots, spurs and sword show him to be a "Gentlemen Officer".

- 3. In the background is Nassau Hall, home of the College of New Jersey (later Princeton University). About 200 British soldiers barricaded themselves in the building until blistering American artillery fire forced them out. You can see captured British soldiers under Colonial guard in the field.
- 4. Two cannons under the command of Patriot Captain Joseph Moulder halted the British charge at Princeton, New Jersey, and gave General Washington time to rally his forces onto victory on January 3, 1777.
- 5. At General Washington's feet, is an English Imperial flag laying on the ground as a symbol of confidence in the general's ability to defeat the British Army.
- 6. Other banners lying on the ground represent the captured colors of Hessian Regiments hired by King George III to fight in America. Washington defeated these German Mercenaries at the famous Battle of Trenton New Jersey on December 26, 1776.

In addition to being a famous artist of American icons, *James Wilson Peale* was a *Revolutionary War Soldier, Scientist, Inventor, Politician* and *Naturalist*.

While *Peale* is best remembered for his many portrait paintings of leading figures of the *American Revolution*, he also established one of the first professional national museums in the *United States of America*.





Graduating from MIT and Harvard Business School, Alex founded Photo Electronics Corporation (PCS), specializing in photography and video production. Over the decades, Alex earned 10 US patents and invented the Video Color Negative Analyzer for motion pictures earning him an Academy Award for technical achievement. Many inventions, developed by PCS, are on permanent display at the Smithsonian Institution. Locally Alex also owned television station WPEC TV-12, the CBS affiliate in West Palm Beach. Alex's many philanthropic achievements include founding the Palm Beach County Cultural Council, the Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts and gifting a million dollars to the Dreyfoos School of the Arts. 




~Crossed & Found~



Thirteen-year-old Kay Telfair believes her life is over when she moves with her family a thousand miles to their new home near the Delaware River in New Jersey. But her life takes an unexpected turn when she meets Anna and discovers a two-centuries-old letter--a letter that could change American history. Before she unravels the letter's mystery, Kay stumbles headlong into an adventure confronting fears she'd never experienced, stretching the limits of her friendship with Anna, and forcing a test of Kay's physical strength that could save her life.



"I'm avoiding any activity that involves excitement...I've learned my lesson." After an adventure-filled June, all Kay Telfair wants is a quiet vacation in Maine with her family and best friend Anna—no drama, no stress. But the thirteen-year-old's hopes for a tranquil August stay in the village of Prospect Harbor soon fade when the girls compete for the attention of a young boy and Kay makes a startling discovery—a discovery that sends the three teens on a dangerous quest.
