# No Vet Left Behind... Missing in America Project!

"I can't promise you that I will bring you all home alive. But this I swear, before you and before Almighty God, that when we go into battle, I will be the first to set foot on the field, and I will be the last to step off, and I will leave no one behind. Dead or Alive, we will all come Home together. So help me, God."

~General Hal Moore before the bloody Battle of the La-Drang Valley Vietnam1965... "The Battle that changed the War in Vietnam"

*No Vet left Behind...*has been an eternal promise and profound commitment to all *American Veterans* from *Bunker Hill* to the blood soaked killing fields of the *Civil War* and *Vietnam*, to the desolate deserts of *Iraq* and *Afghanistan...* "*Dead or Alive, We all come Home!*"

Founded in 2006, the national *Missing in America Project (MIA)* is a veteran remains recovery program with the noble mission to locate, identify and inter, with full military honors, the <u>unclaimed</u> cremated remains of *American Veterans* through the joint efforts of volunteers, private, civic, state and federal organizations.

While it's difficult to comprehend, one state hospital reported over 3,500 unclaimed cremains sitting on their shelves, yet to be identified, and representing a time span from the 1890s to 1971. It is estimated that over 1,000 of these cremains are veterans. This tragedy is happening in every state.

Now through a nation-wide effort, the *MIA Project* continues its mission to locate, identify and inter the unclaimed remains of our forgotten veterans through the combined, cooperative efforts of members of the *American Legion, VFW*, Veteran and, service organizations, local funeral homes, *State Funeral Commissions, State* and *National Veterans Administration Agencies, State* and *National Veterans Cemetery Administrations*.

Working together, these organizations assure that all local, state and national laws are followed in the identification, claiming process and proper interment of the unclaimed veterans' remains, to assure that these forgotten veterans, who served our country, are buried with the honor, dignity and respect they earned.

Since 2006 the *MIA Project* has contacted over 2,100 funeral homes, located 15,259 unclaimed cremains, identified and interred, with full military honors, over 3,200 Veterans, but the work continues. The *Palm Beach Chapter SAR* and local *DAR Chapters* have supported the *MIA Project* for several years providing escorts and support at each of the military internment ceremonies for these forgotten heroes.

In honor and with respect for those Veterans who served our country, Palm Beach Chapter SAR Compatriots attend all of the Missing In America Veteran Internment Ceremonies to help inter the remains of our honored Veterans and military spouses with full military honors including Honor Guards, Flag Ceremony, Taps and 21 Gun Salutes.

These forgotten heroes served honorably in all our Nation's armed conflicts from World Wars I & II, Korea, and Vietnam, to the Cold War, and from all branches including the Army, Marines, Airforce and Navy!





### Life, Love, And War

This moving testimonial to the ravages on the Vietnam War and the inspirational power of love is captured in this latest book from the Barbers, and a must read. *Compatriot Barber* is also the author of three remarkable American Historical Mystery series for young adults/children titled "Crossed & Found", "Stonewalled", and "Gold Hush".

### ~ Overview "Between the Letters-Life, Love, And War"~

Separated by war and thousands of miles, a young navy ensign and his nurse fiancée share their everyday experiences from Vietnam and from back home through hundreds of letters, keeping alive their love, hopes and dreams.

Between these letters, the fledgling officer-in-charge of a U.S. Navy Swift Boat shares his first-person stories of life and death in a combat zone.

### ~Plot Description~

"I miss you!" "Why haven't you written?" "Thank God, you're safe!" These are the beginning lines of some of the hundreds of letters between a freshly-commissioned U.S. Navy ensign and his fiancée, a new nurse graduate, from the start of their relationship until eighteen months later when he returns from Vietnam.

Between these letters are first person accounts of the fledgling naval officer's life in charge of a five-man crew aboard a fifty-foot Swift Boat, patrolling the coastal waters and rivers in "I Corps," the northernmost military operational area of South Vietnam.

The letters and stories show the challenges of life—and death—in a combat zone and provide a glimpse into the stress-filled lives of these two young people, separated by the war and thousands of miles across an ocean and a continent.


