NATIONAL ANTHEM Brief History of the Star Spangled Banner Researched, Compiled, Edited by Donald Lanman

The **Star Spangled Banner** was a poem written by Francis Scott Key (1779-1843) during the War of 1812 (aka the 'Second War for Independence') which was an armed conflict between the United States of America and Great Britain.

Francis Scott Key was inspired to write the poem he called the 'Star Spangled Banner' when he was detained by the British and had watched the bombardment of Fort McHenry during the Battle of Baltimore on the night of September 13-14, 1814.

James Madison was the 4th American President who served in office from March 4, 1809 to March 4, 1817. One of the events during his presidency was the composition of a poem called the Star Spangled Banner which was destined to find a place in American History as the National Anthem of the United States. The <u>War of 1812</u> was yet another conflict with the British, famously called the 'Second War for Independence' that lasted for 2 years 8 months. The cause of the War of 1812 were the actions of the British towards the United States during the Napoleonic Wars against France (1803–1815). The British had disturbed US commerce by stationing British warships off principal ports, had refused to permit trade between the US and Europe and had Impressed (kidnapped) American seamen.

Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Q & A:

• Who wrote the Star Spangled Banner lyrics? Francis Scott Key (1779-1843)

• Why was the Star Spangled Banner written? Francis Scott Key said that the lyrics were "... the first time that someone had put down in words their feelings about their country and the flag"

• Where was the Star Spangled Banner written? The lyrics were written at Fort Henry, Baltimore, in Chesapeake Bay, Maryland

• When was the Star Spangled Banner written? The lyrics were written following the US victory at the Battle of Baltimore, during the War of 1812 on September 14, 1814

• When was the Star Spangled Banner officially made the national anthem? The Star Spangled Banner Lyrics were officially made the national anthem on March 3, 1931 by President Herbert Hoover who signed an act into law

• What is the meaning of the Star Spangled Banner lyrics? The meaning of the Star Spangled Banner Lyrics reflect the patriotic feelings of Francis Scott Key when he saw the enormous US flag flying over Fort Henry

• *What are the Star Spangled Banner lyrics*? The Star Spangled Banner Lyrics are detailed here together with the meaning of the lyrics

Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 1

Oh, say can you see by the dawn's early light What so proudly we hailed at the twilight's last gleaming? Whose broad stripes and bright stars thru the perilous fight, O'er the ramparts we watched were so gallantly streaming? And the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in air, Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there. Oh, say does that star-spangled banner yet wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave?

Meaning of Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 1

• The flag that flew over the fort was enormous. The commander of Fort Henry, George Armistead had commissioned Mary Pickersgill to make "a flag so large that the British would have no difficulty seeing it from a distance"

• The flag could be seen from several miles away and Francis Scott Key was saying that it could be seen in the last light before nightfall and the first light at dawn

- The 'perilous fight' was the Battle of Baltimore during the War of 1812
- The Star Spangled Banner was streaming over the ramparts (battlements) of the fort
- The "rocket's red glare" and the "bombs bursting" used alliteration to describe the cannon fire pounding from the British navy and the cannons firing from the fort (one of the ships was armed with a rocket launcher)

• The angry red glow from the cannon fire enabled Americans to see their Star Spangled Banner was still flying - the British had not captured the fort and hoisted the Union Jack

• The Star Spangled Banner was waving over the 'land of the free' - a reference to the fight for Independence that had resulted in freedom from the tyranny of the British

• The 'home of the brave' lyrics reflect the heroic exploits of Americans to defend their country

• The War of 1812 was popularly known as the 'Second War for Independence'

Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 2

On the shore, dimly seen through the mists of the deep, Where the foe's haughty host in dread silence reposes, What is that which the breeze, o'er the towering steep, As it fitfully blows, half conceals, half discloses? Now it catches the gleam of the morning's first beam, In full glory reflected now shines in the stream: 'Tis the star-spangled banner! Oh long may it wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!

Meaning of Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 2

• Francis Scott Key was describing the perspective from the land as American looked out to hazy images of the British ships

• The 'foe's haughty host' lyrics describe the vessels of the arrogant British

• The lyrics 'dread silence reposes' express the view of the ships that look quiet and still as if resting, but are actually a hive of terrifying activity

• Francis Scott Key describes the high vertical position of the flag over Fort Henry in the lyrics 'o'er the towering steep' and the movement of the flag blowing in the wind, concealing then revealing the Star Spangled Banner

• The sun comes out and clearly shines on the Star Spangled Banner, 'in full glory' lyrics express the grandeur of the flag and a religious connotation

• Francis Scott Key almost makes the Star Spangled Banner lyrics 'cheer' using the patriotic words "Tis the star-spangled banner! Oh long may it wave. O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!"

Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 3

And where is that band who so vauntingly swore That the havoc of war and the battle's confusion, A home and a country should leave us no more! Their blood has washed out their foul footsteps' pollution. No refuge could save the hireling and slave From the terror of flight, or the gloom of the grave: And the star-spangled banner in triumph doth wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!

Meaning of Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 3

• Francis Scott Key describes the British as arrogant and boastful in the lyrics 'that band who so vauntingly swore'

• He is venting his anger at the British with the "foul footsteps' pollution" lyrics inferring that the British poisoned the ground on which they walked

• But the poison and corruption had been washed away by the blood of the British

• The Star Spangled Banner lyrics "the hireling " refers to the British use of Mercenaries (German Hessians) in the American War of Independence

• The Star Spangled Banner lyrics "...and slave" is a direct reference to the British practice of Impressment (kidnapping American seamen and forcing them into service on British man-of war ships). This was a Important cause of the War of 1812

• Francis Scott Key then describes the Star Spangled Banner as a symbol of triumph over all adversity

Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 4

Oh! thus be it ever, when freemen shall stand Between their loved home and the war's desolation! Blest with victory and peace, may the heav'n rescued land Praise the Power that hath made and preserved us a nation. Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just, And this be our motto: "In God is our trust." And the star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!

Meaning of Star Spangled Banner Lyrics Verse 4

- Pride and Patriotism is the theme of the last verse
- Francis Scott Key uses emotive words such as 'freeman', 'home', 'blest', 'victory', 'triumph', 'conquer' and 'peace' in the Star Spangled Banner lyrics
- He was a deeply religious man and his words reflect his belief that God was on the side of the Americans
- He refers to the American nation and fighting for a just cause
- The words "In God is our trust" combines the concepts of religion and patriotism and are believed to be the origin of the official motto of the United States "In God we trust". The unofficial motto of 'E pluribus unum' which was adopted when the Great Seal of the United States was created in 1782

38 Historical Facts about the Star Spangled Banner

Fact 1: During the War of 1812 in addition to the British operations on the Canadian frontier, the British tried to capture New Orleans and the cities on Chesapeake Bay.

Fact 2: On August 24, 1814 the British had entered Washington where they burned the Capitol, the White House, and several other public buildings.

Fact 3: The Burning of Washington DC stirred the highly patriotic feelings of outraged Americans including Francis Scott Key and these dramatic events were no doubt in his mind when he wrote the Star Spangled Banner

Fact 4: Francis Scott Key was a lawyer who owned a law practice in Georgetown, a suburb of Washington, D.C.

Fact 5: Francis Scott Key had appeared many times before the Supreme Court, and had been appointed the United States District Attorney.

Fact 6: On August 24, 1814, Dr. William Beanes, a prominent US physician was taken prisoner by the British

Fact 7: Lawyer Francis Scott Key was asked to help to get Dr. Beanes released.

Fact 8: Baltimore, located in Chesapeake Bay, Maryland, was a key British target during the War of 1812.

Fact 9: The British were in the Chesapeake Bay, and Francis Scott Key left for Baltimore where he met with Colonel John Skinner, a government agent who arranged for prisoner exchanges.

Fact 10: On September 5, Francis Scott Key and Colonel Skinner boarded a small American flag-of-truce ship to meet the British naval officers on the British flagship, HMS Tonnant

Fact 11: The negotiations were cordial and the British agreed to release Dr. Beanes but Francis Scott Key and Colonel Skinner were not permitted to return to Baltimore until after the intended bombardment of Fort McHenry, which was located in the outer harbor of Baltimore

Fact 12: The Americans were transferred from HMS Tonnant back on to the American flag-of-truce ship to wait behind the British naval fleet

Fact 14: George Armistead (1780 – 1818) was the commander of Fort McHenry during the Battle of Baltimore in the War of 1812.

Fact 15: When Armistead arrived at Fort McHenry, to prepare for the eventual attack by the British fleet, he ordered the hoisting of "a flag so large that the British would have no difficulty seeing it from a distance"

Fact 16: Armistead commissioned a local Baltimore flag maker called Mary Pickersgill (1776-1857) to make two flags, "one American ensign, 30 X 42 feet, first quality bunting" and another flag 17 by 25 feet."

Fact 17: The job was too large for one person to complete so Mary Pickersgill enlisted the help of seamstresses including her mother, Rebecca Young, her daughter, Caroline, her 2 nieces, Eliza Young and Margaret Young and a free African American apprentice seamstress called Grace Wisher

Fact 18: The large flag weighed about 50 pounds (23 kg) and measured 42' x 30' and contained over 400 yards (366 meters) of cloth, and included 15 stripes and 15 stars, one for each of the 15 states of the union.

Fact 19: The stripes and the blue canton were of made of English wool and the stars were made of cotton

Fact 20: Each of the stars on the flag measured 24 inches (60 cm) across and each stripe was two feet (60 cm) wide.

Fact 21: The flag took six weeks to make and was delivered to Armistead on October 27, 1813

Fact 22: A receipt for \$405.90 was given to Mary Pickersgill for the large flag. Another receipt for \$168.54 was provided for the smaller storm flag

Fact 23: The enormous American flag was raised over Fort Henry inclement weather and could be seen from a distance of several miles

Fact 24: On September 13, 1814 the British fleet attempted to sail around Fort McHenry en route to Baltimore.

Fact 25: The Battle of Baltimore commenced and American troops fired the cannons of Fort Henry hoping to halt the British advance

Fact 26: The British cannons returned the fire and pounded Fort Henry until 7:30 on the second morning of the engagement on September 14, 1814. The British fired 1,800 shells at Fort McHenry during the 24 hour conflict, of which about 400 landed inside the defensive perimeter

Fact 27: Fire was exchanged at the Battle of Baltimore for a total of 25 hours. Given the force of the British navy, Francis Scott Key was half expecting a British victory. The British guns were much bigger than the Americans and they were able to attack without getting hit back. From his position, behind the British fleet, he had no idea of the outcome of the Battle of Baltimore...

Fact 28: Francis Scott Key looked towards Fort Henry in the early morning light of September 14, 1814 and saw not the Union Jack flying over the fort, but the American flag flying proudly in the wind. The enormous US flag announced the American victory at the Battle of Baltimore

Fact 29: The British, unable to destroy Fort Henry, had made the decision to leave

Fact 30: Francis Scott Key returned to Fort Henry and was inspired to write the poem "The Star Spangled Banner"

Fact 31: The patriotic words of his poem "The Defense of Fort McHenry" which would become known as "The Star Spangled Banner" were read by his brother-in-law, Judge Joseph H. Nicholson, a commander of a militia at Fort McHenry who immediately arranged for the poem to be distributed as a handbill

Fact 32: The Baltimore Patriot newspaper soon printed the poem, and within weeks, Francis Scott Key's poem, now called "The Star-Spangled Banner," appeared in print across the country.

Fact 33: Francis Scott Key later explained that the Star Spangled Banner poem "...was the first time that someone had put down in words their feelings about their country and the flag"

Fact 34: The War of 1812 resulted in a stalemate but the Battle of Baltimore were immortalized in the words of the "The Star-Spangled Banner" and forever gave this special name to the flag it celebrated.

Fact 35: "The Star-Spangled Banner" poem was put to the music of a British drinking song called "To Anacreon in Heaven."

Fact 36: On October 17, 1814 it was announced that after a play at the Baltimore Theatre that "Mr. Hardinge will sing a much admired new song, written by a gentleman of Maryland, in commemoration of the gallant defense of Fort McHenry, called The Star Spangled Banner."

Fact 37: On March 3, 1931, President Herbert Hoover signed an act into law that made "The Star Spangled Banner" the national anthem of the United States of America.

Fact 38: 1845: The patriotic fervor of Americans led to the belief in the Manifest Destiny of the United States.
