



Strangers in a Strange Land! Revolutionary War's Loyalists...

The history of the *Revolutionary War* is really the story of the *"First American Civil War"*! It's a story of a struggle between a diverse population of early *Americans* separated by 13 individual colonies and two distinct tribes labeled *Patriots* and *Loyalists*, and making the *American Revolution* not simply a national story, but a global one.

During the American Revolution, those who continued to support King George III of Great Britain came to be known as Loyalists. Thus, Loyalists are to be contrasted from Patriots, who supported a Revolution to gain self-rule against Great Britain.

Historians have estimated that during the *American Revolution*, between 15 and 20 percent of the white population of the colonies, or about 500,000 people, were *Loyalists*.

Being in the minority the *Loyalists* faced two kinds of persecution during the Revolution, one constitutionally and the other by lawless mobs. *Patriots* simply refused to tolerate anyone who was active on behalf of the *Crown* and or called for the *King* to send troops to destroy the *Patriots*.

Even before the war started, it was at the hands of these mobs that *British* officials and *Loyalists* first suffered direct attacks. Probably the worst of the revolutionary mobs was that which gathered in the streets of Boston.

In 1765, at the time of the *Stamp Act* agitation, large crowds in Boston attacked and destroyed businesses and property including the houses of community leaders *Andrew Oliver* and *Lieutenant Governor Thomas Hutchinson*.

As the war concluded with *Great Britain* defeated by the *Americans* and the *French*, the most active Loyalists were no longer welcome in the new United States of America, and sought to move elsewhere in the *British Empire*.

The complex nature of the *Loyalists* story is well told by period author *Maya Jasanoff*, in her book, *Liberty's Exiles: American Loyalists in the Revolutionary World*.

Through the individual stories of selected loyalists, *Jasanoff* details their thoughts, ideas, decisions and motives to leave *America* following the war to resettle in *England* and or the *English* Colonies of *Canada, Caribbean,* Australia, *India* and *Africa. Jasanoff* notes:

"Perhaps the most surprising truth about Loyalist refugees was how varied a role ideology might play in their decision making. Though they shared an allegiance to the king and a commitment to the empire, their precise beliefs otherwise ranged widely.

Some expressed sophisticated intellectual reasons for their position while for others, loyalism stemmed from a personal commitment to the existing order of things, a sense that it was better to stick with the devil you knew.

Also widespread was a pragmatic opinion that the colonies were economically and strategically better off as part of the British Empire. The extent and depth of loyalism points to a fundamental feature of this conflict that the term "revolution" belies.

This was quite simply a civil war as routinely described by contemporaries on both sides of the Atlantic. Polarizing communities, destroying friendships, dividing families, most famously Benjamin Franklin, the founding father, from his only son William, a loyalist.

The **Revolutionary War** was the longest war Americans fought before **Vietnam** and **Afghanistan**, and the bloodiest until the **American Civil War**, 1861–1865.

Recovering from the contingency, coercion, and sheer violence of the American Revolution explains why so many loyalists chose to depart, driven by fear of harassment as much as by commitment to principle. By the same token, self–interest could be as powerful a motivator as core beliefs, as the cases of runaway slaves and Britain's local Indian allies perhaps make most clear."

Thus, this range of reasons, ideological and otherwise, led so many Loyalists to the same defining choice of leaving the new *United States of America*.

Of the sixty thousand **Loyalists** who left *America*, about eight thousand whites and five thousand free blacks traveled to *Great Britain*, often to find themselves, *strangers in a strange land*.

The majority of refugees, however, headed to the *British* colonies, accepting *English* incentives of free land, provisions, supplies and related forms of compensation as reward for their loyalty to the *Crown*.

Over half of the *Loyalists* relocated to the northern *British* provinces of *Nova Scotia, New Brunswick* and *Quebec*, helping to transform these northern regions from the once *French* dominated area to the *English Canada* of today.

A further six thousand Loyalists, especially from the *American* south, traveled to the **English Colonies** of **Jamaica** and the **Bahamas** along with over fifteen thousand of their slaves. The **East India Company** and its army also benefited acquiring *American* born *British* serving officers, businessmen and professionals, including two sons of the notorious turncoat **Benedict Arnold**.

One of the most surprising migrations was the nearly twelve hundred black loyalists moved to *Africa*, under the sponsorship of *British* abolitionists, to found the utopian inspired settlement of *Freetown*, in *Sierra Leone*.

In short, while thousands of *Loyalists* landed in every corner of the *British Empire*, a majority of the *Loyalists* (estimated at 80%) decided to remain in the new *United States of America*, and were eventually welcomed back to enjoy full citizenship.






